

# 1. <u>ASSOPICON - 2024</u>

The 2024 joint international conference of the Federation of Indian Physiological Societies (FIPS) and the Association of Physiologists of India (ASSOPI) was successfully hosted by the Department of Physiology at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Patna, under the esteemed leadership of Director and renowned physiologist Prof. (Dr.) G. K. Pal. Held from October 21st to 26th, 2024, the event gathered over 600 registered experts, researchers, and student delegates to engage in dynamic discussions cantered around the theme: "Clinical and Interventional Physiology: Current and Future Scenario."

With the generous support of the ICMR and DRDO conference grant, the event emerged as a landmark in fostering collaboration, innovation, and advancement in physiological sciences.

The conference featured an extensive array of activities, including clinical workshops, CME

sessions, symposia, plenary lectures, and scientific paper presentations.

# **Pre-Conference Workshops:**

The initial two days of the event hosted **ten specialized pre-conference workshops**, providing participants with practical, hands-on training and insights into cutting-edge physiological techniques and interventions. Key workshops included:

- Autonomic Function Testing and Reporting: Hands-on training in autonomic function tests for clinical application in health and disease.
- **Electroencephalography (EEG):** Covered EEG fundamentals, recording techniques, and data interpretation.
- Nerve Conduction Studies (NCS): Focused on the role of NCS in diagnosing neuromuscular disorders.
- Yoga Therapy: Explored the physiological benefits of yoga and its role in clinical practice.
- Infertility Assessment and Reporting: Provided insights into infertility diagnosis through semen analysis.
- Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS): Addressed neuromodulation techniques with an emphasis on movement disorders.
- Research Paper Publication: A detailed guide on manuscript preparation, submission processes, and publication ethics.
- Polysomnography: Practical training in sleep study techniques and polysomnography interpretation.

Renowned experts from AIIMS Patna and prestigious institutions across India conducted the workshops, enriching the learning experience for participants.

With robust participation and ICMR and DRDO's support, the conference marked a significant milestone in the continued growth of physiological sciences in India.
























































# 4. Endorsement of ASSOPI Awards, 2024

Dr. G. K. Pal, General Secretary informed the GB that a total of 31 nominations for various awards of ASSOPI including 1 nomination for Fellowship Title of ASSOPI were received, and a committee consisting of two subject experts for each award was constituted for evaluating the nominations. The report of the committee was approved by the President of ASSOPI. EB in its meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2024, approved the list of recipients of ASSOPI Awards, 2024. The awardees received awards on 24<sup>th</sup> October, 2024 in the inaugural ceremony of ASSOPICON-2024. The GB unanimously endorsed the list of recipients of ASSOPI Awards.

# 5. Presentation of audited statement of account by Finance Secretary

Dr. S. Velkumary, Finance Secretary presented the detailed audited statement of account for the year 2023-24. After a thorough discussion, the audited report was approved by GB, which was proposed by Dr. B. S. Shankaranarayana Rao and seconded by Dr. S. B. Deshpande.

# 6. Status of ASSOPI Journal

Dr. G. K. Pal informed that as discussed in the last GBM held on 28<sup>th</sup> October 2023, during 9<sup>th</sup> ASSOPICON held at KGMU Lucknow to transfer the International Journal of Clinical and Experimental Physiology (IJCEP), which is owned by Dr. G. K. Pal as Editor-in-Chief, will be transferred to ASSOPI as the official Journal ASSOPI by paying Rs. 10.00 lakhs to its Proprietor Dr. Mueen Ahmad. Accordingly, journal IJCEP has now been formally acquired by the association. The transfer of ownership included the copyright, domain, and all associated assets of the journal. This acquisition was finalized following financial negotiations with the proprietor, reducing the initial quoted expense from ₹12 lakhs to ₹10 lakhs. Funds were duly transferred from the association's account, and the journal is now the official organ of ASSOPI.

As approved in the last GBM, in addition to the Editor-in-Chief of the journal to be elected/nominated every two years as per bye-law, Dr. G. K. Pal will be the regular Executive Editor of IJCEP. General Secretary informed that the efforts are underway to index the journal in reputed databases such as PubMed and Scopus to enhance its visibility and credibility. Members were requested to submit articles and promote the journal within their professional networks to increase its reach and impact.

### 10. Proposal for new ASSOPI awards

Dr. Pal informed that Dr. Indira Chakravarty presented a proposal for the establishment of the *Prof. Mukta Sen Memorial Award* in the field of reproductive physiology, last year. Dr. Indira Chakravarty had agreed to pay the rupees five lakhs of seed money for the award. Dr. Pal informed that Dr. Indira Chakravarty has informed that due to her personal problems, she was not available last year, and will make award seed money payment soon. However, as the seed money for the award has not been paid yet by the donor, it has not been implemented this year.

# 11. Presentation of a brief report by Organizing Chairman

The organizing chairman, Dr. Tribhuwan Kumar, HoD, Physiology, AIIMS Patna, reported that the conference had seen overwhelming participation, with total registrations nearing 500. He mentioned that initial registrations were around 360, which were further supplemented by more than 150 spot registrations for workshops and conference. He highlighted that over the past three days, 12 workshops had been successfully conducted, demonstrating strong interest and engagement. He explained that the process had been initiated following approval in the last General Body GB meeting of 2023. He noted that in the past two months, he and his team had worked diligently to organize and streamline the event.

The chairman stated that expert faculty from various institutions had been invited to demonstrate techniques and mentor participants during the workshops. He informed that 10 workshops and two CME sessions focusing on animal experiments and Grant Writing had taken place. According to him, the response had been tremendous, with requests exceeding capacity. In certain cases, registrations had to be capped at 50 participants, despite ongoing interest.

He pointed out that one key realization from the workshops was the necessity to conduct more hands-on training sessions for junior colleagues and students. He emphasized that such sessions provided essential guidance in laboratory setups, technique development, and foundational skills crucial in the current medical and research environment. The chairman proposed that the association consider organizing similar workshops across different zones to ensure comprehensive coverage, suggesting that these workshops could extend over one to two days.

The chairman remarked that the conference marked a historic milestone with 22 symposiums, which he described as a first for the association and other physiology organizations including APPI and PSI. He stated that each symposium featured renowned experts, ensuring valuable insights for attendees. He acknowledged the challenge of attending all sessions due to three parallel symposiums per day. In addition to the symposiums, he reported that the conference would also include 22 plenary lectures and two panel discussions.

He assured that meticulous attention had been given to logistics, food arrangements, and overall participant experience from the beginning. According to him, a diverse food court had been curated to enhance the experience for all attendees.

The organizing chairman expressed his heartfelt gratitude to the Executive Director and CEO Dr. G. K. Pal for his full involvement in the conduct of the conference and untiring support inspite of his very hectic schedules to make this a grand event. He also thanked the entire organizing team for their hard works and sincere efforts. He concluded by expressing confidence that the conference would be remembered fondly by participants and would pave the way for future advancements in the association's events.

# 12. Any other matters (with permission of chair)

# i. State and Zonal Chapter Coordination:

Challenges in smaller states like Goa were discussed. It was suggested that Goa can merge with Maharashtra for better organization of ASSOPI activities.

# ii. ASSOPI Membership Fees:

As decided in the last EB and GB meeting, it was decided to increase the membership fees from Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 5,000 from 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2025.

# iii. Fees for Fellowship Title:

It was decided to increase the fee for fellowship title from Rs. 11,000 to Rs. 16,000 (rupees sixteen thousand only), out of which one thousand will be paid as application fee (non-refundable) and fifteen thousand will be paid as the fee for fellowship title.

# iv. Physiology in Clinical Medicine:

Plans for integrating physiology into clinical settings, including the establishment of clinical-interventional physiology unit/department in the institutes were discussed. It was emphasized that those who are senior members of the faculty and in administrative responsibilities in the institutes should facilitate these objectives.

# **Epicardial Fat and Cardiovascular Risk: A Critical Link:**

Epicardial adipose tissue (EAT) plays a crucial role in cardiovascular health, significantly impacting the risk of heart attacks and other cardiovascular conditions. As a metabolically active fat depot, EAT contributes to local inflammation and systemic metabolic processes, promoting the development and progression of coronary artery disease (CAD). Thicker EAT is closely associated with increased inflammation, which can accelerate CAD severity. Additionally, the volume of EAT correlates with cardiovascular risk factors such as obesity and metabolic syndrome, making it a valuable biomarker for predicting future cardiovascular events. EAT also secretes adipokines that regulate inflammation, either increasing or decreasing cardiovascular risk. Elevated levels of pro-inflammatory cytokines are often observed in patients with greater EAT thickness. Clinically, measuring EAT can help identify individuals at higher risk for cardiovascular events, allowing for more targeted preventive strategies. Efforts to reduce EAT through lifestyle modifications or medications show promise in lowering cardiovascular risk, positioning EAT as a potential therapeutic target. However, while EAT is generally associated with increased cardiovascular risk, some studies indicate that not all patients with high EAT experience adverse outcomes. This suggests that additional factors may influence cardiovascular risk, highlighting the need for further research to refine treatment approaches and improve patient outcomes.

# The Role of Yoga in Modulating Epicardial Fat and Enhancing Cardiovascular Health:

The connection between epicardial fat and yoga is gaining attention in the field of cardiovascular health. Epicardial adipose tissue (EAT), a type of visceral fat, plays a key role in heart function and disease, contributing to the onset of cardiovascular diseases (CVD) and influencing cardiac remodeling. Yoga, known for its therapeutic effects, has demonstrated benefits in improving cardiovascular risk factors, suggesting a potential role in reducing EAT levels and enhancing heart health.

Research underscores yoga's positive impact on cardiovascular health, particularly in cardiac rehabilitation and risk management. Studies show that yoga-based rehabilitation programs can improve left ventricular ejection fraction (LVEF) in patients after coronary artery bypass grafting (CABG), reflecting better cardiac performance. Additionally, yoga may complement existing therapies by addressing CVD risk factors like obesity, which is closely linked to elevated EAT levels.

Epicardial fat significantly contributes to cardiovascular disease through its role in local inflammation and the progression of conditions such as coronary artery disease. Fortunately, EAT levels can be modified through lifestyle changes, including dietary adjustments, physical activity, and possibly yoga. This underscores the need to adopt comprehensive strategies that promote cardiovascular wellness.

Although yoga appears promising for enhancing heart health and reducing epicardial fat, more research is required to fully elucidate how yoga influences EAT and to what extent. Advancing this area of study could pave the way for non-invasive, accessible approaches to preventing and managing cardiovascular disease.



# **Psychophysiology**

# Study of relationship between cognitive and emotional processes of the brain and body and their interaction with each other

# **Neurophysiology**

Branch of physiology dealing with functions of the nervous system i.e the study of functional properties of neurons, glia and networks

Psychological and social factors are thought to influence risk for a range of physical illnesses including coronary heart disease, high blood pressure, type 2 diabetes, infectious illness, bronchial asthma, and musculoskeletal pain. These associations are underpinned by the impact of psychological stress and other biobehavioral stimuli on the systemic biological responses implicated in disease risk [Several systems are involved, with cardiovascular, neuroendocrine, immune, inflammatory, metabolic, and musculoskeletal responses all being relevant].

Psycho-neurophysiology deals with the physiological effects of the psychological and neurological responses to these threats.

# Akbar Tomb Sikandra

Akbar's tomb is the mausoleum of the third and greatest Mughal emperor Akbar. The tomb was built in 1605–1613 by his son, Jahangir and is situated on 119 acres of grounds in Sikandra, a suburb of Agra, Uttar Pradesh

# Itmad-ud-Daula

Tomb of I'tim d-ud-Daulah is a Mughal mausoleum in the city of Agra in the Indian state of Uttar Pradesh. Often described as a "jewel box", sometimes called the "Bachcha Taj" or the "Baby Taj", the tomb of I'tim d-ud-Daulah is often regarded as a draft of the Taj Mahal

# Fatehpur Sikri

A sand-stone city, which was the royal capital of Akbar. Later abandoned due to shortage of water, the site displays a number of buildings of significant historical importance. A World Heritage Site, it houses 'Buland Darwaja' which is one of the finest examples of Mughal architectural splendour at its height and Sheikh Salim Chishti Dargah.





# Keoladeo National Park (56 km drive from Agra)

Bharatpur Bird Sanctuary, as the Park was formerly named, was declared a protected sanctuary in 1971 and established as a national park on 10 March 1982. Due to its exceptional avian biodiversity, it has also been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site (1985)

# Panch Mahal

Panch Mahal is a palace in Fatehpur Sikri, Uttar Pradesh, India. The Panch Mahal meaning 'Five level Palace' was commissioned by Akbar. This structure stands close to the Zenana quarters which supports the supposition that it was used for entertainment and relaxation.





# Prem Mandir (54 km drive from Agra)

Prem Mandir is a Hindu temple in Vrindavan, Mathura district, Western Uttar Pradesh, India. The temple was established by Jagadguru Shri Kripalu Ji Maharaj. It is maintained by Jagadguru Kripalu Parishat, an international non-profit, educational, spiritual, charitable trust.

# Banke Bihari Temple (53 km drive from Agra)

Banke Bihari Temple is a Hindu temple situated in the town of Vrindavan, Mathura district of Uttar Pradesh, India. The temple is dedicated to Banke Bihari who is believed to be the combined form of Radha and Krishna.
